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The Virginia Small Grains Board FY 2020 – 2021

I. Introduction

Revenue collected in the fiscal year ended June 30, 2021 totaled \$207,193.25 up from \$151,296.39 collected the previous year. Production of wheat was higher compared to 2019 and the prices received by producers were slightly higher than the previous year. The check-off rate is one-half of one percent of the net market price per bushel. Grains subject to the check-off are wheat, barley, oats and rye.

The wheat crop in Virginia during the fiscal year ended June 30, 2021 totaled 7,800,000 bushels on 130,000 harvested acres. Yield per acre was 60 bushels, down from 62 bushels the previous year. The value of the wheat crop was estimated at \$41,340,000 up from \$32,876,000 a year ago and down from \$43,710,000 two years ago. The average price per bushel for the season was \$5.05, which was .35 higher than the prior year.

The barley crop averaged 63 bushels per acre on 7,000 harvested acres. Yields the previous year were 65 bushels per acre. Production totaled 441,000 bushels with a value of \$1,235,000. The value of the crop for the previous year was \$1,365,000 and \$1,638,000 in 2018. Growers harvested the same number of acres as they did in 2019.

The Virginia Agricultural Statistics Service discontinued its reporting of data related to the rye crop; therefore, the Virginia Small Grains Board cannot include any rye statistics in this annual report.

The check-off revenue is used by the Board to provide for programs that are designed to improve the profit potential of growing small grains in Virginia. More specifically, the Board contracts with private industry and government institutions to conduct market development, promotion, education, publicity, and research projects. The Board funded 14 projects during the fiscal year ended June 30, 2021.
